## **Volunteerism at CCC**

### Covid-19 Virus Awareness Building – Kazakhstan





On February 6 and 7, 2020, CCC Sanitary Doctor; Turganbayeva Zhanna, Ecologist Engineer; Beshakova Aigul, and Sanitary Doctor Karagoishina Dina conducted a series of awareness seminars on Covid-19 virus to various companies and organizations.
